WALLS ARE FINISHED FOR MAMMOTH CANNERY

Workman Busy Putting on Roof and Laying Floors

BIGGEST OF KIND IN STATE

Structure is a Credit to Hillsboro and Community

The A. J. Ray & Son's cannery walls are now completed and the workmen are putting on the roof and will soon be laying the cement floors. One has no conception of the magnitude of the structure until you pass through it from Washington street south to Baseline. When completed, it will represent an expenditure, inclusive of machinery, of around \$90,000, and will be the largest building devoted to exclusive canning in the state.

It will have ample capacity to take care of a largely increased acreage of vegetables and small fruits, and is a credit to Hillsboro and its founders.
