LOCAL MILLS RUN ON URGENT ORDERS

Both Hillsboro Companies Have All They Can Do

LOCAL LOGS BEING CUT

What State is Doing Along Industrial Lines

Both Hillsboro sawmills are cutting to capacity these days and much local timber close in is being turned into lumber. The G. H. P. Lumber Co. is getting logs from the Tillamook rail line camps and is also cutting from the local supply over in South Tualatin, the logs being hauled in by auto trucks.

Hamilton & Regan are running every day at their mill north of the city, and they are clearing up the merchantable timber on the Wall-Mahon tract adjoining the northern city limits. When this supply is exhausted the mill will ship in by rail from the mountains.

Oregon Industrial Notes—Portland—Public dock commission lets contract for pier No. 5 municipal terminal at \$37,865.

Lebanon farmer will sell 150,000 strawberry plants before season is over.

Seufert-Deschutes link of Columbia highway in Wasco county let for \$189,871.

Albany—Payallup & Sumner Fruit Growers Canning Co. sales for 1919 totaled \$3,160,210.43, more than double car before.

A model house built entirely of Douglas fir will form practical demonstration of utility of West Coast woods for home building at second "Own Your Home" show in New York, May 1 to 8.

Astoria—United Box Co. incorporates for \$100,000.

Medford—Oregon Growers Co-operative Association of Eugene purchases fruit packing plant of Rogue River Fruit and Produce Association.

Portland—Western Grain Co. buys 5800 acres in Gilliam county at approximately \$40 an acre.

Newport—Modern hospital may be erected soon.

Lebanon—A record breaking corn crop of 67 bushels taken from one acre of land.

Marshfield—Due to lack of patronage, Pacific Steamship Co. may withdraw City of Topeka from service to this port.

Klamath Falls—Big Lakes Box Co. to erect sawmill on banks of Lake Ewauna.

Albany—\$20,000 for a new building at fair grounds planned. Portland—Chevrolet Motor Co. to erect \$150,000 warehouse and zone headquarters.

Milton Box Co. will make for this season between 1,500,000 and 2,000,000 apple and other fruit boxes.

Astoria—Highway between here and Seaside to be paved soon. Pendleton—800 acres of Indian land near here offered May 28.
