Despite the tardy Spring, houses rapidly are being built along the highway between here and Beaverton, and over a score are under construction. Hillsboro has several new houses under way, and twenty or more will be built before the Summer wanes.

Workmen are getting the new cannery well under way, and in a few weeks the machinery will be installed. The big boiler has been set and the smokestack placed perpendicular.

Senator Wood will in a few weeks start his addition to the Main Street brick occupied by W. W. Boscow, and it is currently reported that E. J. Lyons is figuring on a brick to replace the old structure across the street from the Weil Building.
