

SCHOOL NEWS

The state two mill tax for elementary education is urgent for Washington County and for the whole state.

1. Expenditures for schools in Washington County have increased less than 6 per cent. on an average during these years of war prices.

2. More money must be raised for schools or more schools must close up. There are 130 schools in Oregon which did not open this year.

3. Nearly one-half of all the money used for schools in Washington County is raised by special taxes in the various districts and one-fourth of the taxable property is escaping almost entirely from any part of this, therefore it is more just to raise a part of the additional funds required by a two mill tax on all the property of the county.

4. If this bill passes the weakest districts will have at least \$900 to run their schools even if no special tax is voted. If it does not pass a large number of rural districts will have to vote from 6 to 20 mills to secure \$900 which is about the minimum required to support a one-teacher school.

There are many districts, some of them in Washington County, where the tax payers will not vote such a tax and the children will not have a school if we do not

come to the rescue with the two mill tax for elementary schools.

On May 21 vote 314 yeas.
