Every sawmill of importance in Washington County—and many of minor cut—is in operation these days and there is plenty of work for the sons of the big timber. The increase in stumpage price has caused many mills to start cutting on small timber tracts within a few miles of the city and the auto truck is busy getting the cut to the mills. The season of 1920 promises a lumber cut fifty per cent. higher than any former year.

Owing to the demand for labor farmers are finding it hard to keep help.

THE SILO

In different parts of the country agricultural colleges are carrying on a special campaign to interest farmers in silo construction. As price of hay climbs higher and higher the value of the silo for storing food for cattle is becoming more apparent.
