

EX-SERVICE MEN

Corvallis, May 10.—More than 1000 ex-service men are now attending O. A. C., many of whom are represented in the principal student activities of the college. Some of the most important student body offices for next year are to be held by overseas vets.

"Rook" officers with few exceptions are overseas men. Henry Anderson, of Aberdeen, Wn., an overseas vet, has been elected president of next year's senior class, and John Cowley, another service man, was elected class representative on the student council. Overseas men hold other prominent positions in the senior and sophomore classes for next year. Several prominent students were decorated for valor in France.

The Crip club, composed of men wounded or disabled in France, has a membership of 180 men. More than 900 men are taking advantage of the state aid of \$25 a month.

MR. EDWARDS

C. J. Edwards, candidate for Joint Senator for the Counties of Washington, Tillamook, Yamhill and Lincoln, was in Hillsboro one day this week in the interest of his candidacy. Mr. Edwards is opposed by W. R. Dennis, of

Carlton, and John U. Smith, of Newberg. He has no opposition from Washington County. Mr. Edwards is urging, in behalf of his candidacy, that Tillamook County, of which he is a resident, will be entirely without representation in the Senate unless he is selected. Yamhill County, the home of both opposing candidates, is already represented by a Senator. The justice of Tillamook County's claim has been recognized in Washington County which has offered no candidate for Joint Senator.

Mr. Edwards was a member of the 1919 Legislative Session representing Tillamook County in the House. He invites inspection of his record and particular of his support of legislation designed to protect the road fund and has always been a staunch advocate of securing a dollar's worth of road for each dollar expended. He stood with W. G. Hare, now candidate for Senator of this County, in attempting to protect the Highway fund and exerted every effort to see to it that the road fund was used for the purpose of building roads rather than paying royalties to Paving Companies and large contractor's profits. Mr. Edwards has long been a resident of the district and while making no extravagant promises, invites the closest inspection of his record.

MR. BOOTH TALKS

"The State Highway Commission is not asking for more money," said R. A. Booth, commissioner, in addressing a Lane County audience on the 4 per cent road bond limit measure; "all we want is the power to capitalize the income now on hand. The state road funds are now taken from two sources—the one cent tax on each gallon of gasoline and the automobile license fees. The state constitution, as it now reads, prohibits more than 2 per cent being put into the roads, and what the commission wants is an amendment of this clause so 4 per cent can be put into the roads. A direct additional tax is not asked for, nor is any increase in the gas tax or auto license. Mr. Booth also brought out that "a new road program is not to be rushed through, but the present one is to be finished providing the voters of Oregon back up the 4 per cent limit measure."

Commissioner Simon Benson is also on record against rushing construction too rapidly, considering high labor costs and the high cost of money, but favors ratification of this 4 per cent bonding amendment so there will be authorization to issue bonds at such times as favorable conditions justify. Final control over actual bond authorization rests with the legislature, as unless the legislature passes enabling legislation under the 4 per cent amendment, the highway commission is without authority to issue bonds.

PLANS DRAINAGE

Farmers in the Wapato Lake district met in Gaston Saturday evening, May 8, to discuss plans for better draining that area, and finally decided to have a preliminary survey made, to determine the best method of removing the flood waters.

A committee of three was appointed to take charge of the matter, of which T. E. Armstrong was made chairman. R. R. Easter, of Hillsboro, showed a number of interesting slides of similar drainage districts in Clark County, Wash., where large areas of waste lands were made productive at a cost approximately \$25 per acre, and a maintenance cost of less than \$3 per acre.

Practically every land owner of the effected district was present at the meeting, and it seemed to be the unanimous opinion that a drainage district should be formed. The committee plans to take up at once the survey of the

area, to determine the approximate cost of draining.
