LIMITATION OF FOUR PER CENT INTERESTNESS
FOR PERMANENT ROADS.—Purpose: To amend Section 7 of
Article XI of the Constitution of the State of Oregon so as to permit the
creation of debt and liabilities including previous debts and liabilities
for the purpose of building and maintaining permanent roads to the
amount of four per cent of the assessed valuation of all the property
in the State of Oregon, instead of two per cent as now provided by law.

NO PROPERTY TAX—NO DIRECT TAX
NO INCREASE IN AUTO LICENSE FEES
NO INCREASE OF GASOLINE TAX

Keep these three facts in mind. The present auto license fees and gasoline tax will pay both the principal and interest on all the bonds under this amendment, and will yield an annual surplus besides for other state highway work. No additional taxation of any kind.

THE SILO

In different parts of the county agricultural colleges are carrying on a special campaign to interest farmers in silo construction. As price of hay climbs higher and higher the value of the silo for storing food for cattle is becoming more apparent.

As an example, take one county in Eastern Oregon; 2 years ago it had 4 silos. Last year 26 more were erected and the owners figure that these 30 silos saved them 1,000 tons of hay which at \$30.00 a ton is a saving of \$30,000.

A silo is one method of reducing overhead operating cost of farming.
