CAR SHORTAGE IS FLY IN OINTMENT

Only Drawback to the Lumbering Interests

ASTORIA TO GET BIG MILL

Largest Lumbering Plant in America Brought to Coast

Only the big car shortage keeps the lumber interests of Oregon from expanding one hundred per cent in 1920. Every mill, large or small, is literally swamped with orders, or could be swamped if they would take them. The car shortage, however, is making mill men super-cautious, because it is useless to take orders which can not be filled because the product can not be shipped. Many mills now have their yard capacity filled—and it takes money to meet payrolls. Without full shipment in many instances means subsequent losses. And yet, the lumber interests are still forging ahead with unprecedented prices and new mills are being installed.

Oregon Notes—Astoria—Largest lumbering plant in America is to be brought to Astoria through option secured on a hundred and fifty acres on Youngs Bay. Total investment, including the erection of a mill, expected to reach the \$2,000,000 mark.

Hood River—\$2,000,000 distributed on the 1919 apple crop to date to growers of this district.

Oakridge—Ground cleared for erection of mill for Oakridge Lumber Co., which recently purchased 7,000,000 feet of timber in the Cascade National forest.

Toledo—New Toledo State Bank is being constructed.

Portland puts on campaign to get 1000 houses built to relieve congestion.

Cove to get new store and Masonic and Odd Fellows hall combined.

Alsea Lumber Co. ships carload fir logs to New York for veneer material.

Business men of Union and Baker counties unite with Eastern Oregon Light and Power Co. to erect a \$200,000 auxiliary hydro-electric plant.

Salem—Supreme court affirms Judge Bingham in decision that Public Service was right in making rates to include cost of depreciation on plant.

Standard Oil Co. building 17 tanks steamers to bring oil to the United States from other countries.

Gold Hill—New \$49,000 concrete bridge over Rogue River is completed.

Brownsville—Canning company plant is now in full operation.

Glenada—New sawmill to be built here.

North Powder—Work on new water system to start at once. Work to start on highway here.

Hood River—New highway in Hood River and Wasco counties completed.

Albany Mill & Elevator Co. to open for business again this year.
