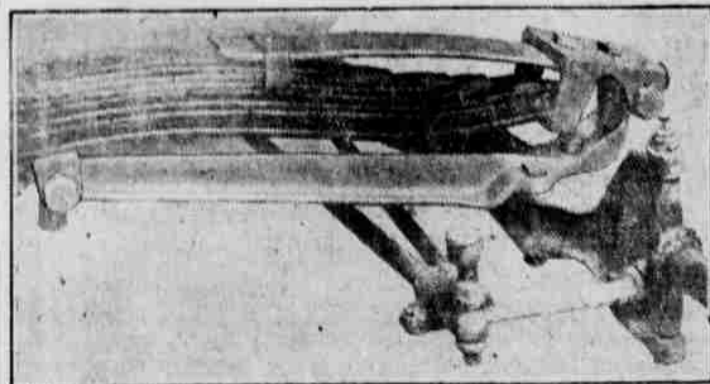

Bond Election for Proposed Shute Park Improvement

CURFEW AND LICENSES

Proposal up to Amend Charter so Stages May be Licensed

Next Tuesday (June 8) will be election day for Hillsboro, and the incident is fraught with much of interest to the city, for the result of the vote will tell whether or not Shute Park will be improved. The bond issue as well as the amendments are proposed by the City Council, and speak for themselves. The wording on the ballots will be:

Submitted by the City Council—Shall the City of Hillsboro, Washington County, State of Oregon, issue and sell bonds of said City in the sum of \$15,000.00 to be known and designated as "Park Bonds," for the maintenance and improvement of "Shute Park," such bonds to be payable one or before 20 years, and to bear interest at the rate not exceeding 6 per cent.

The two charter amendments are:

Submitted by the City Council—To license, tax and regulate vehicles used for transportation purposes out of, into, or through the city. Purpose: To amend Section 39, in Chapter VI, of the charter of the City of Hillsboro, Oregon, so as to permit the city council to license, tax and regulate vehicles (except railway cars or trains operated under franchise granted by the City) used for transportation of persons or passengers, goods, wares, merchandise, or articles, into or out of, or through, the City.
