CLOVER MIDGE SCARCE

Clover seed midges are apparently very few in numbers this season. Whether this is due to weather conditions entirely, or to the crop practices of this county, it is difficult to say. Experts, however, at the United States Entomological Station of Forest Grove, state that the midge has not made its appearance, and that there is little likelihood of its showing up this season. Should the insect attack the clover, it will be much later than in previous years, and farmers will be able to make as much of a hay crop as they desire. In previous years where clover seed crop was desired, it was necessary to clip the clover about the first of June to avoid the midge attack, but present reports would indicate that the hay crop may be allowed to go until the latter part of June, and unless more of the insects show up before that time, the hay may be allowed to go even longer if necessary.—County Agent.

They will not only have a real get-together, but are also planning some judging contests, and are offering prizes for a boys' and girls' judging contest. GUERNSEYS

Corvallis, May 31.—The Oregon Guernsey breeders' association will ship from New York 70 Guernsey cattle, which are said to be the finest stock imported from the Isle of Guernsey. Professor E. L. Westover of the college dairy department left Thursday for New York and will supervise the shipment to Portland. The Guernseys will be distributed to members of the Guernsey Breeders' association in Clatsop, Tillamook, Washington, Clackamas, Polk and Coos counties as soon as Professor Westover returns with the shipment. This is the first time that the associations of Oregon have attempted to import stock to such a degree, several individual shipments have been made before, however.
