STEEL SOON LAID ON NEW RAILROAD

Company Expects to Run Trains Into Nehalem by Fall

BANKS TO VERNONIA LINE

Lumber Shipments Largest in History of Northwest

The new railroad between Banks and Vernonia will soon be laying steel on the Banks-Buxton end of the line and the company expects to be operating trains clear thro to Vernonia in 1921. The new line has ample capital behind it and will tap a magnificent timber and agricultural belt. The prayer of the settlers in the rich Nehalem Valley to the east of the P. R. & N. line for rail communication with the outside world will soon be assured.
