FRANCIS M. WHITE, WEALTHY, SUED BY WIFE

Asks for Divorce and One-Third of Realty and Alimony

LIVE AT FOREST GROVE

Plaintiff Alleges Husband is Worth \$155,000 or Over

After a year and a half of married life Lillian Thies White, wife of Francis M. White, sues the husband for divorce, alleging cruel and inhuman treatment. The complaint covers several pages of closely typewritten manuscript, and says the husband was morose at times, and falsely accused her. She also alleges that Mr. White told her he did not care for her and that married life was not what he had expected when he led her to the altar. She also says that Mr. White really wanted another woman with whom he kept company before he married her.

The complaint sets forth that Mr. White is owner in fee simple of several hundred acres of land up Gales Creek, and that the land in question is worth at least \$125,000, and that he owns personal property valued at \$30,000 or more. She wants the court to fix her gross alimony; asks for one-third the real estate; asks for \$5,000 suit money, and \$125 per month for the keep of herself and their little son, aged between one and two years.

The Whites own a home in Naylor's Addition to Forest Grove. White is prominent in the west end of the county, and is well-informed, being noted as a student.

The two were married at Forest Grove, Dec. 25, 1918.
