Cars to be Sent to Northwest to Relieve Shortage

STATE BUSY AS GOPHERS

Authority Says Spuds May Continue High

Portland will be made ports of call for the Johnson line of motorships operating to Scandinavian countries, according to advice received by the port traffic bureau providing sufficient cargo, a minimum of 2000 tons—is offered.

Portland—Sending of more railroad cars to this territory to relieve the serious shortage which has been effected by the American Railroad Association, according to a message received.

Salem—Dehydration plant will handle \$2,000,000 pack.

Newport—Work to start on \$500,000 north jetty.

Willamina and Grand Ronde railroad incorporated, \$5,000,000 State University to spend \$1,500,000 on new buildings.

Oregon City Manufacturing Co. will give employees two weeks vacation.

Salem—Phex Co. increases its capital to \$4,000,000.

Huntington—Sheep shearing a month later at suggestion of Oregon Humane Society, reduces the loss of ewes and lambs by thousands.

Philomath College to be rebuilt State highway commission will rebuild Portland bridges at cost.

Portland—\$250,000 log boom being built on Willamette slough.

Potato crop Oregon, Washington, Idaho, decreased 12,000 acres.

High prices of potatoes may continue, according to reports to departments of agriculture. Reduction of 5 per cent in acreage planted last year has been reported.

Pilot Rock's \$35,000 high school building completed.

Albany—Southern Pacific buys more than \$10,000,000 worth of timber in this vicinity.

Riddle to have sawmill.

Klamath drainage district votes \$200,000 bonds to improve 20,000 acres swamp land bordering lower Klamath Lake.

Estimated that \$750,000 will be paid out at Salem during July for the loganberry crop.

New York Federal Reserve Bank announces that Oregon, Washington and Arizona have been admitted to list of states for which checks are collected at par. This makes 40 states for which this service is rendered. Eight southern states have yet to be accorded this privilege.

Corvallis—Second unit of home economics building and \$100,000 dormitory to be built during vacation.

Hermiston—First crop of alfalfa selling at \$31 per ton.

State highway commission authorizes all necessary hard surfacing on Columbia river highway from coast to Pendleton, and on
