LUMBER BUSINESS IMPROVING RAPIDLY

Last Week Showed New Business Gain of 15 Per Cent.

THE PRODUCTION IS LOW

Strike and Car Shortage Consequent Still Hurting

The switchmen's strike in the big centers is still seriously hurting the car situation and as a consequence rail movement of lumber is yet in the clumps.

The 130 mills reporting to West Coast Lumbermen's Association on production, orders and shipments for the week ending June 29 show: Production, 87,937,195 feet, which is 5.36 per cent. below normal; New business, 33,994,490 feet, or 39.64 per cent. below production; Shipments, 62,201,315 feet, or 29.28 per cent. below production; Unshipped balance, rail trade, 6,991 cars; Unshipped balance, domestic cargo, 62,204,956 feet; export cargo, 59,941,860 feet. An improved situation is indicated in the fact that new business booked for the week under review was 13 per cent. heavier than similar business for the previous week.

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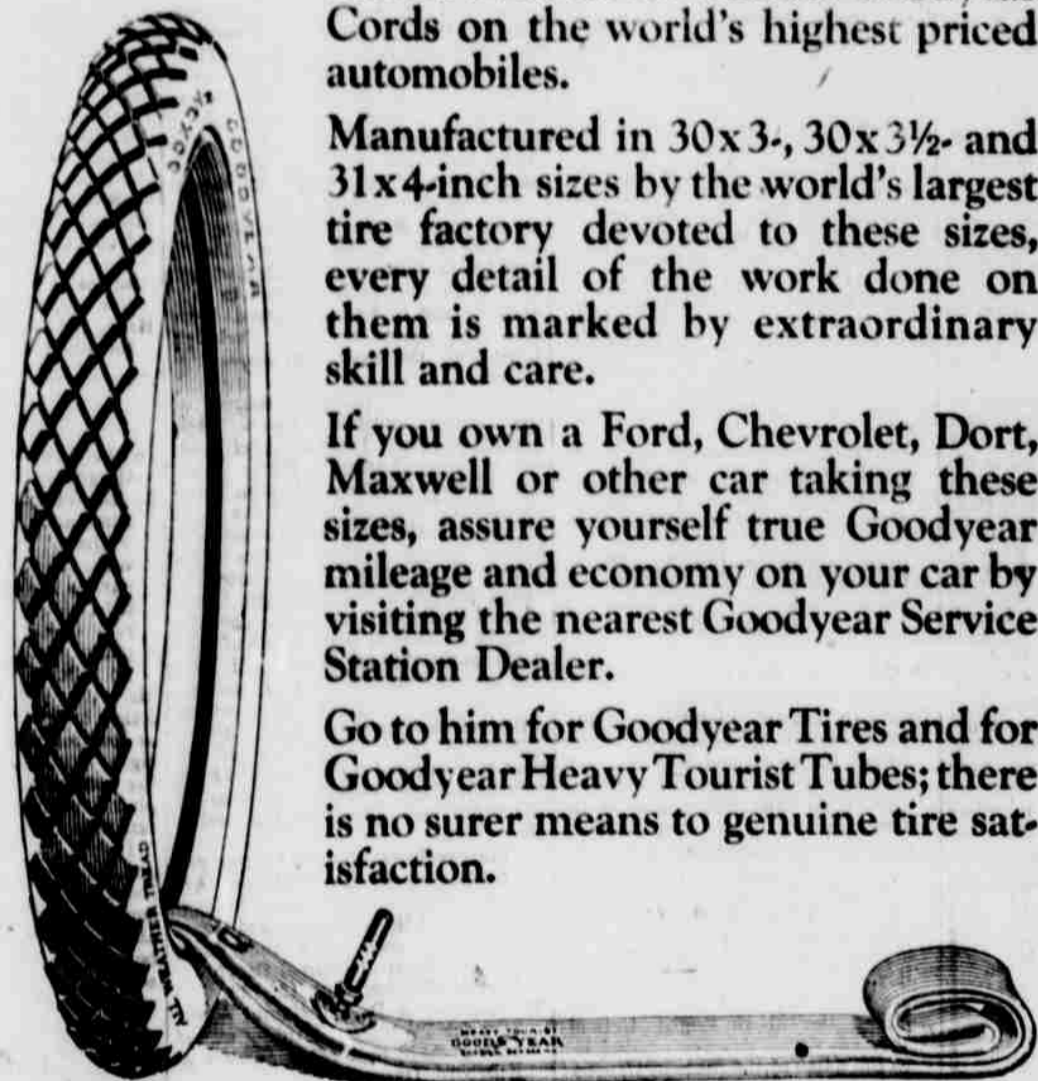
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
