GROWERS GET BUSY

The Executive Committee of the Oregon Growers' Co-operative Association in session on July 9, closed a deal with the Sutherland cannery and packing plant whereby the Association obtains possession of the plant. This plant is one of the best in Southern Oregon, has a large prune drier, prune packing plant, canneries, lime sulfur manufacturing plant, and juice plant. There are 15 city lots and 600 feet of siding. The plant will be of great value to the Association in the North Umpqua.

Carlton and Forest Grove.
A contract for a 24 tunnel drier at Carlton for the Association has been let to L. R. Bailey & Company, of Portland. This same firm also has the contract for a modern prune packing plant to be erected at Forest Grove. This plant will be erected on property joining the Forest Grove Cannery. At Medford, the association is rushing work on a large packing shed adjoining the cold storage plant. Packing tables are being made, apple graders have been purchased, and the building will soon be completed. At Grants Pass, a temporary house has been leased until Jan. 1, when the new plant at that point will be completed. The packing plant at Riddle is one-half completed, and the foundations of the packing plant at Myrtle Creek are started. At Sheridan, the contract for the first unit, a 40 tunnel drier has been let to J. C. Groce.

LUMBER CUT IS LARGER THAN EVER

State Will Exceed Any Year With Some Camps Closed

WASCO CO.'S BIG ORCHARD

Nine Miles Long, Mostly Apples, Has 5,000 Acres

The state lumber cut for 1920 will exceed any production in the history of the state, notwithstanding many camps have been closed down. New mills are being installed all over the state as orders are piled up, with movements slow due to car shortage.

Industrial Notes—

Coquille—Work on Marshfield Coquille highway being rushed.
Astoria—\$83,876 contract was made for installation of cargo cranes.

Glenbrook—Ten cars machinery arrived from Glenbrook sawmill.

Condon—New modern hotel is nearing completion.

Dorris—Two large sawmills and box factory to be built here.

Corvallis—Arrangements being made to build \$20,000 bakery.

Eugene—Packing plant running to capacity.

Borrowing 500 longshoremen from Seattle, Portland needs many more.

Astoria—600,000,000 feet of timber to be logged before end of year.

Log and lumber production in Oregon and Washington may be seriously interfered with by the shortage in fuel oil.

Five new laws and six amendments to the constitution will be voted on in Oregon in November.

Receipts of grain past year at Portland, 12,606,400 bushels. Increase when milled into flour 1,622,800 barrels.

Portland exports first half of 1920 totalled \$30,700,737.

Astoria—29 vessels loaded 37,717,173 feet lumber in 30 days.

Corvallis—Agricultural college shops making good phonographs for \$45.

Portland—Another state wide newspaper advertising campaign is soon to be launched by the Associated Industries of Oregon to call the attention of the people of this state to Oregon products. Display advertisements will be inserted in 35 Oregon newspapers.

Portland—Expansion of Oregon's markets to the four corners of the earth has greatly increased the demand for tin cans here. The American Can Co. has applied for permit to construct a 3-story concrete plant to cost over \$1,000,000.

Salem—New plant of the Oregon Pulp and Paper Company, under construction here, expected to be in operation in about 2 months. Will be one of the most modern paper manufacturing plants in the country.

Eugene—Mill established here for sole purpose of grinding fir trees into excelsior now employs 128 men in the woods.

Klamath Falls—New industry assured in incorporation here of Klamath Pipe Manufacturing Company. Capital stock \$150,000.

The longest orchard in the world is that of the Dufur Land and Orchard Company, seven miles from The Dalles. It is nine miles in length, occupies 5000 acres and is mostly apples.
