Car Shortage for Lumber Shipments Retarding

The log output is gradually getting back to normal and the Tillamook line is resuming its service bringing out the cut of the big camps. Mills have started again on full time, and car shortage is the only fly in the ointment. It begins to look as though we need another McAdoo to handle this phase of the situation.

It appears that in the newspaper business these gentlemen are agreed that the cost of living has gone up in the paper line, by stages of 100 per cent.
