Farmers who mortgage their land for the purpose of making improvements so they can make money farming.

Industries which finance purchases of raw material and pay rolls until their products are marketed.

Public utilities which must finance the cost of equipment, improvement and extension.

Contractors who borrow money for payrolls and supplies, pending payments from counties, states, cities and other public and private bodies.

Logging and lumber companies who are heavy borrowers and great employers of labor.
