## PORTLAND'S EXPORTS CROWN THE RECORD

Ship Nearly Three Times the Product of July, 1919

WHEAT THE GREAT ITEM  
Wheat, First; Flour, Second, and Lumber Third

Portland's export record broken last month with a total valuation of commodities sent to foreign ports during July of \$8,053,099, a gain of 296 per cent over the same month last year. Wheat was responsible for \$1,657,387, or more than half the amount. Flour was next, with a total valuation of \$2,501,794; lumber accounted for \$585,907, and general merchandise amounted to \$283,061. Fourteen ships and three sailing vessels were dispatched to offshore ports during the month. Exports for July, 1919, totalled \$2,715,350.

Columbia River channel to be widened at bar from 300 to 500 feet.

Hood River—Cull apples for cider vinegar a drug owing to Volstead law.

Banks to have \$35,000 Catholic church.

Portland—Seven ships loading lumber on Columbia for South America.

Salem—Willamette University spending \$100,000 on new building.

Work on Link River dam, Klamath Falls, to cost \$100,000 begins.

Cottage Grove—Local lumber mills again in operation, but unless car shortage relieved will be forced to close again.
