CLUB SELECTS

The Hillsboro Club, with an attendance of twenty-five, named a ticket for the mayoralty and council Tuesday night. E. L. Johnson received the highest number of votes for mayor; Chas. E. Wells, councilman for the East ward; C. B. Buchanan for the West ward, and J. H. Garrett for the North. Fred Sewell was endorsed for treasurer and the recordership goes to E. L. McCormick, so far as the club is concerned, if he wishes to run. The following were named to notify the nominees and to fill vacancies if any take place—Stevenson, Killen, Goar, Corwin and Donelson. Mayor Wall was present and said he would not enter the race again under any circumstances. He said the city's financial condition was as good as could be expected. The plan of amending the charter so as to have a commission form of government, with a salaried city manager, was discussed and later the change of charter may be advocated.

Heinrich, of near Shefflin, sues Eugene Smith and the Auto Transit Co. for \$402.94, for damages sustained the Heinrich auto when the stage company driver struck the car, in the City of Cornelius. The Heinrich car was driven by a daughter of Heinrich. G. N. Lewis sues Anna Lewis for divorce, alleging marriage at Grand Rapids, Mich., in 1893. He says the wife struck him with a stick of wood, back in 1917.

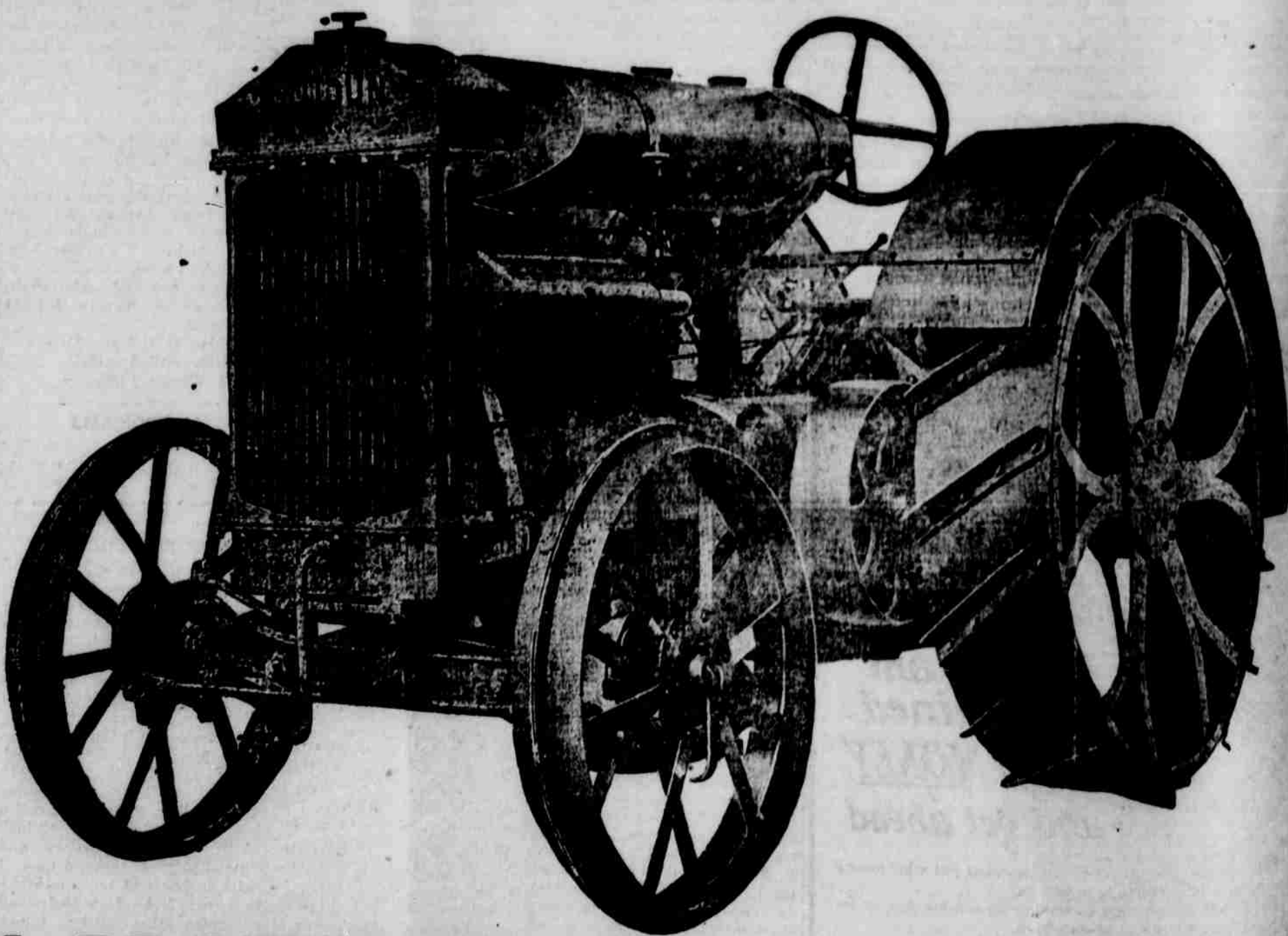
