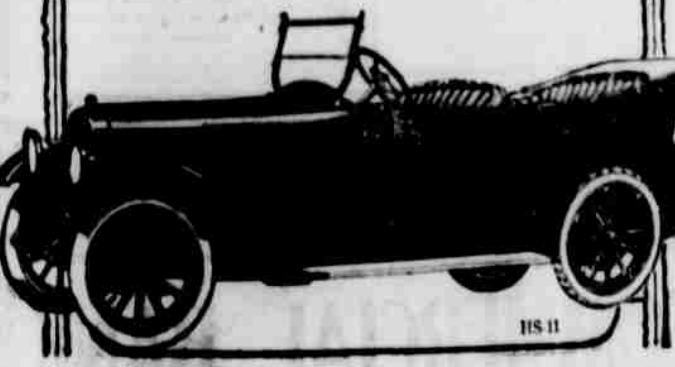

JAMES L. BENEFIEL

James Irvine Benefiel, an Oregon pioneer of 1852, died at Waco, Ore., September 13, 1920. He was born in Shelby Co., Indiana, Sept. 3, 1836, and crossed the plains to Oregon in 1852, at the age of 16 years. During the trip his mother died of cholera. Upon reaching Oregon the father and family settled in Yamhill Co. For several years deceased resided near Mountsindale. He was married to Miss Louisa Branson, Oct. 7, 1860, his wife being a daughter of pioneers of 1848. Eight children were born to the union. Helen and Albert died in infancy. The widow and following children survive—Chas. W. Frank G. Ernest W. James W. John R. and Iva. All were with the father when he passed away. A sister, Mrs. Ellen Hall, lives in Idaho. He is also survived by the following half brothers and half sisters: Thomas Benefiel, Rochester, Wis.; Wilson Benefiel, Portland; Chaney and Perry Benefiel, Manning; and Mrs. Martha Coleman, of Banks.
