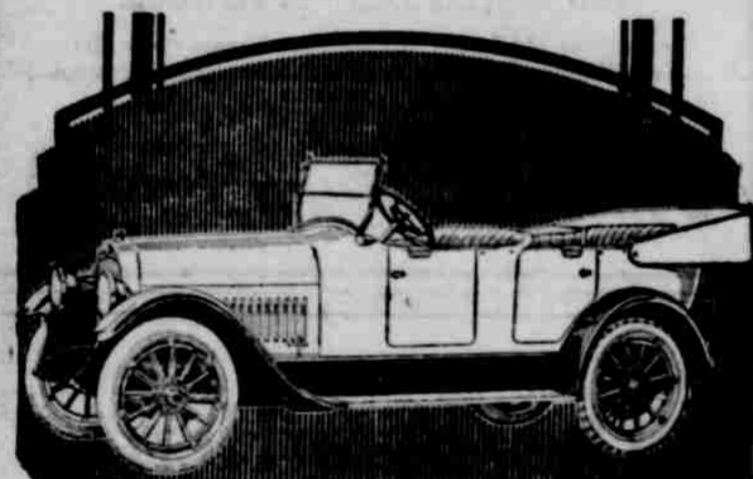

CELEBRATES 92D BIRTHDAY

Mrs. Catherine A. Adams, well known in Hillsboro since pioneer days, celebrated her ninety-second birthday at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Chas. Pio, 1125 East Harrison St., Portland, on Thursday, Sept. 30, 1920, in the presence of relatives and friends. The afternoon was enjoyed with singing old songs, loved by the complimented guest in olden days, by conversation and music. Among the friends calling were school mates of Mrs. Pio, who visited her forty years ago, as little girls, when Mrs. Adams resided in Hillsboro. There was also quite a representation from the Sunday School class of the Evangelical Church, Market St., where Mrs. Adams attends when the weather permits.

Mrs. Adams was born in Bergen, Genesee County, N. Y., and came to Oregon with her husband and two small children. They came across in an ox team, setting first in Marion County. They came to Hillsboro in 1862 and lived here until the death of Mr. Adams in 1905. Since that time Mrs. Adams has lived with her daughter, Mrs. Pio.

On July 1, 1920, she was crowned the Mother Queen of Oregon by the Oregon Pioneer Association, being the oldest pioneer mother attending the meeting of the Association. Those present were—
