DEAF MAN KILLED

Henry Michael, aged about 50 years, was run down by a Gales Creek & Wilson River train near the Aagaard sawmill, on Gales Creek, Saturday evening, Oct. 16, about 5 o'clock. Michael was going from the millyard to supper and did not hear the train approaching, as he was very deaf. He was badly mangled and died instantly. Coroner Limber went to the scene of the fatality Saturday night, and held an inquest the first of the week. Michael left no means of identification other than his name on the payroll. He formerly worked at Everett, Wash., with a mill company, and at other points in Washington.

COST OF WHEAT

Farm Management, O. A. C.—How much does it cost to produce a bushel of wheat? It cost twelve wheat growers in Sherman county \$1.92 per bushel to produce wheat last year. The cash costs, not including the farmer's time and interest on his investment, was 94 cents per bushel. The difference between the actual cost and the cash cost was 68 cents.
