COST OF MILK

The Executive Committee of the Washington County Farm Bureau has made arrangements to undertake a cost of milk production project in this county for the coming year. This will be taken up in cooperation with the Extension Service of the College and the County Agent's office at Hillsboro.

There probably is a no more important problem to the Washington County dairymen and one upon which they welcome assistance than to be able to state how much it costs to produce 100 pounds of milk or a pound of butter fat, and yet back the statements up with facts and figures. As a project of Educational value both to dairymen and consumers a work of this nature comes in at a very opportune time. In these days of high costs and uncertain prices on farm products, the dairymen must conduct their operations on a business-like basis. They should profit by having data which will assist them to produce more efficiently. On the other hand the consumers are entitled to learn from an unbiased investigation and report approximately what it costs to produce the milk and butter which represents so important a part of their food requirements.

An effort will be made by the Farm Bureau dairy project committee to get up at least 50 dairymen in the county to give reliable information on the past 12 months cost of operation and production, and who will also agree to keep accounts during the next 12 months, of the cash expenses, labor, and feed put into their dairy herds, and their production.

O. T. McWhorter, County Agricultural Agent, assisted by R. V. Gunn, Farm Management Specialist at the College, is planning to begin this survey at once. Immediately following election, they will probably start field work in the Banks community, where it is expected a number of the 50 co-operating dairymen will be located. Other communities will be visited as soon as the dairy project committee makes complete arrangements.

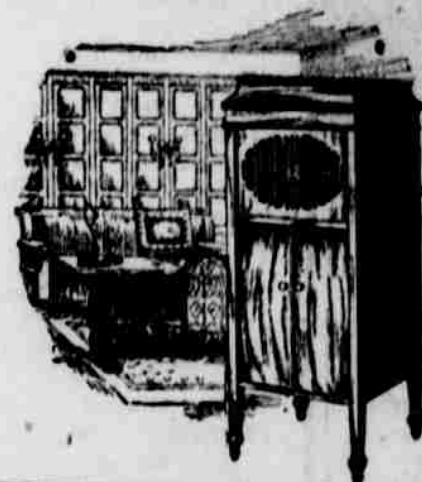
