THE OREGON PRUNE

The delicious Oregon prune that was kicked about for so many years like Champ Clark's famous houn' dog, is now coming into its own as the aristocrat of the breakfast table. And one of the ways of its coming is through a canning process at the Eugene plant of the Oregon Growers' Cooperative Association.

J. O. Holt, packing manager of the Association, is responsible for the statement that if the dried prune is stewed just right, it will be soft but not broken and that the juice will be clear as amber. When it is otherwise, the suggestion is made that it is the fault of the cook and not the prune.

Oregon dried prunes, that have been stewed scientifically, packed in cans, are now being placed on the market through the Association. In the process the prunes are placed in a can, syrup added, then sealed and stewed for half an hour. When opened they will be found to be whole and the syrup of amber clearness.—Oregon Prune Growers' Association.
