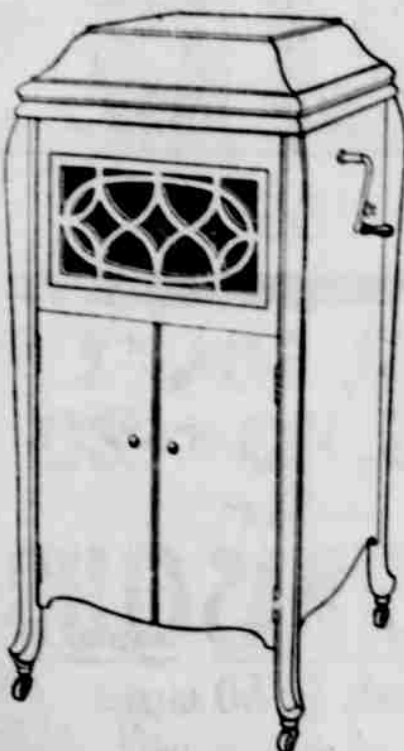

FARM BUREAU

The Hillsboro Farm Bureau Community, with C. H. Bamford in charge of organization, has outlined a program of Farm and Community development for 1921 as follows:

1. Horticulture—A pruning school to last four days, at which practically every phase of pruning and care of trees, vineyards, etc., will be discussed and demonstrated. Clayton Long, extension Horticulturist of the Oregon Agricultural College is expected to help with this work. D. G. Lilly is the Community Committee member in charge.

2. Poultry—To hold a series of not less than four poultry meetings and demonstrations with the assistance of H. E. Cosby, Poultry Extension Specialist, Clyde Robertson in charge.

3. Rodent Control—To provide and help distribute squirrel poison in the community. Farmers present at the community meeting stated that there is a need for concerted action to poison off the common house rat. This may be undertaken also. R. N. Baker is in charge.

4. Crop Improvement—To secure seed for the growing of certified seed potatoes. It is expected that six or eight farmers will grow certified seed potatoes. It has been pointed out that this county is especially adapted to seed potato production. D. G. Lilly and C. H. Bamford are in charge.

5. Dairying—To place two more pure bred bulls in the community, and to hold one community meeting to discuss livestock diseases and troubles. Thos. Williams, committeeman in charge.

The Community meeting endorsed the County Farmers' Week, which will be held in this county, January 17 to 22, at which there will be speakers on the subjects of Dairying, Poultry Raising, Horticulture, and Farm Crops.

MRS. MINERVA BRIDGES

Mrs. Minerva Alice Bridges died at the home of her son, Chester Bridges, South of Oak Park, November 25, 1920, after an extended illness. Her maiden name was Minerva Alice Pogue, and she was born in Texas in 1854. She was married in that state to Jas. Monroe Bridges, in 1884, and in 1886 they moved to Oregon. A year later they bought the Bridges home at Oak Park. The husband died in 1915, as did the youngest son, Adelbert. The only surviving child is Chester.

Of her immediate family she is survived by a sister, Mrs. S. M. Brooks, of Texas, and a half brother. The funeral took place Saturday, under the direction of Undertaker Geo. J. Limber, and interment was in the Odd Fellows' cemetery.

Mrs. Bridges was a woman of fine character, and was universally esteemed. She was a member of the M. E. Church, and for many years was a member of the Degree of Honor, A. O. U. W.
