WORK FOR FARM HOME

Plentiful evidence that the Oregon W. C. T. U. has not entered a foreign field in seeking to establish and maintain a farm home for orphan and dependent children is found in the archives of this organization during the more than quarter of a century it has been giving aid and counsel to the women and children of Oregon. As far back as 1888 the W. C. T. U. branch in Portland established a baby home, one of the first of its kind to make an appearance in Oregon. This home is now regarded as one of the largest and most helpful of its kind in Oregon.

The present Florence Crittenton home for wayward and unfortunate girls, and the travelers' aid work, now under the supervision of the railroad systems, are two other important humanitarian movements launched and put into successful operation by the W. C. T. U. of Oregon.

Because of this record of achievement, the organization is now finding a ready response to its appeal for funds in the present \$125,000 campaign drive which is under way throughout the state. This fund is needed to purchase and put into operation a farm home where orphan and dependent children will be given that training and home influence which is so necessary during the early years of their lives.

The present campaign drive has been universally endorsed by all persons interested in child welfare work in Oregon. If the

present progress is continued the drive should be practically completed by the close of the present week.
