

OREGON PRUNE NOTES

With the rather bad weather to be expected during the next few weeks, the fruit grower can put in his time on inside work, such as packing boxes. It is also suggested that now would be a fine time to re-model dryers if necessary, rather than to wait until the busy season.

It is not too late to spray with Bordeaux for anthracnose. Although rather late, better late than not at all.

Growers who have pruning might begin now to relieve the risk of work next spring.

The business of the Oregon Growers' Cooperative Association has assumed such proportions

that during the month of November, checks were issued for \$540, 19.23 by the Association and its affiliating company, the Oregon Growers' Packing Corporation, according to a report of W. I. Staley, secretary and treasurer.

PRUNE MINCEMEAT

And now we have prune mince-meat. That is, in making mince-meat, the housekeeper may use prunes instead of raisins and find it quite the thing, and at the same time less expensive.

J. O. Holt, manager of the Packing Department of the Oregon Growers' Cooperative Association, announces that mince-meat with prunes instead of raisins, is now being made at the Eugene plant, and has already been placed on the market.

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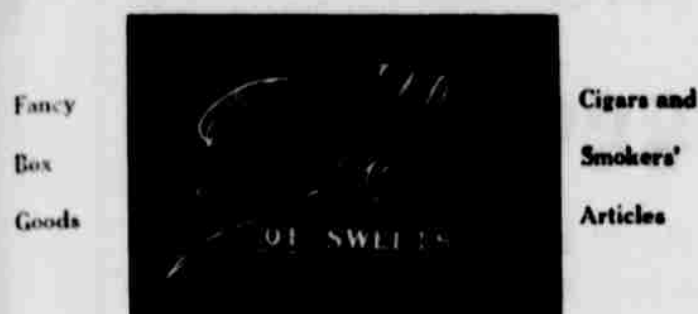
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
