ORCHARD SCHOOL

An orchard management school,
starting Tuesday, December 28,
at 1 p. m., will be held by the
Hillsboro Farm Bureau Commu-
nity. The meeting place the first
day will be at the farm of D. G.
Lilly, Committeeman, at Hillsboro.

Demonstrations will be given
on the pruning of apples, pears,
prunes, and in fact all tree fruits
and nuts adapted to this locality.
Questions of management of or-
chard soils, fertilization, etc., will
also receive attention.

One feature of the school will
be that those in attendance will
do actual pruning work instead
of just witnessing demonstrations.
The school is free and open to
all residents of the county.

Clayton Long, Horticultural
Extension Specialist, will be in
charge of the school. Earl Pear-
ey is Horticultural Project Lead-
er for the Washington County
Farm Bureau, under whose aus-
pices the work will be done.
