AGRICULTURAL CLASS
 O. A. C., Corvallis, Dec. 22—Carl G. Bechen, son of Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Beche, of Route 1, Hillsboro, is a junior agricultural student in the Oregon Agricultural College. He completed the two years of study in general agriculture last June as a preparatory for his major in animal husbandry. He is advanced work he is enrolled for includes all farm stock with the exception of dairy stock and poultry. The work includes a study of breeds, breeding, judging, feeding, marketing, disease and prevention, sanitation, livestock management, and some work in the social sciences. The classroom and laboratory work is supplemented with special trips under the supervision of an instructor of the State Fair, Pacific National Livestock Show and various stock farms in the Willamette Valley for special study. The trips, which the students take are expected to demonstrate to the student the practical application of the things taught him in classroom and laboratory.

The work which Mr. Bechen selected is designed to fit the student for the actual raising of livestock on the farm. To stimulate interest in judging work, stock judging teams are selected from the two upper classes to represent the college at the various fairs in judging contest against the teams of the University of British Columbia, University of Idaho, and Washington State College at the various fairs in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

Ray C. Geiberger, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Geiberger, of Tualatin, is a junior in the school of agriculture. The two years of general agricultural work required by the school was completed by Mr. Geiberger last June. The work in animal husbandry in which he is enrolled is designed to fit the student for the actual raising of livestock on the farm. The classroom and laboratory work includes a study of all farm stock with the exception of dairy stock and poultry. The two years of advance work includes a study of the breeds, breeding, judging, feeding, marketing, disease and prevention, sanitation, livestock management, and some work in the social sciences.

The department of animal husbandry supplements classroom and laboratory work whenever possible with special trips to the various fairs, stock shows, and visits to livestock farms in the Willamette Valley with the idea of connecting up the things taught with the practical working of these things on the farm. To stimulate further interest in judging work, stock judging teams are selected from the two upper classes to represent the college at the various fairs in judging contest against the teams of the University of British Columbia, University of Idaho, and Washington State College, at the various fairs in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

Washington county has 13 representatives in the school of agriculture. John Jeppesen and Wilbur W. Weed are seniors; Carl G. Bechen, Ray C. Geiberger and Edgar H. Swenson, juniors; William H. Dierdorff, Fred M. Kuok and Emil G. P. Tipp, freshmen; Owen R. Helm, Walter Koschitzky, John Puhols, Clair R. Sample and Charles W. Stewart, vocational. All of the vocational with the exception of Mr. Helm and Mr. Puhols are ex-service men that are being sent to school by the federal government for special training in agriculture.
