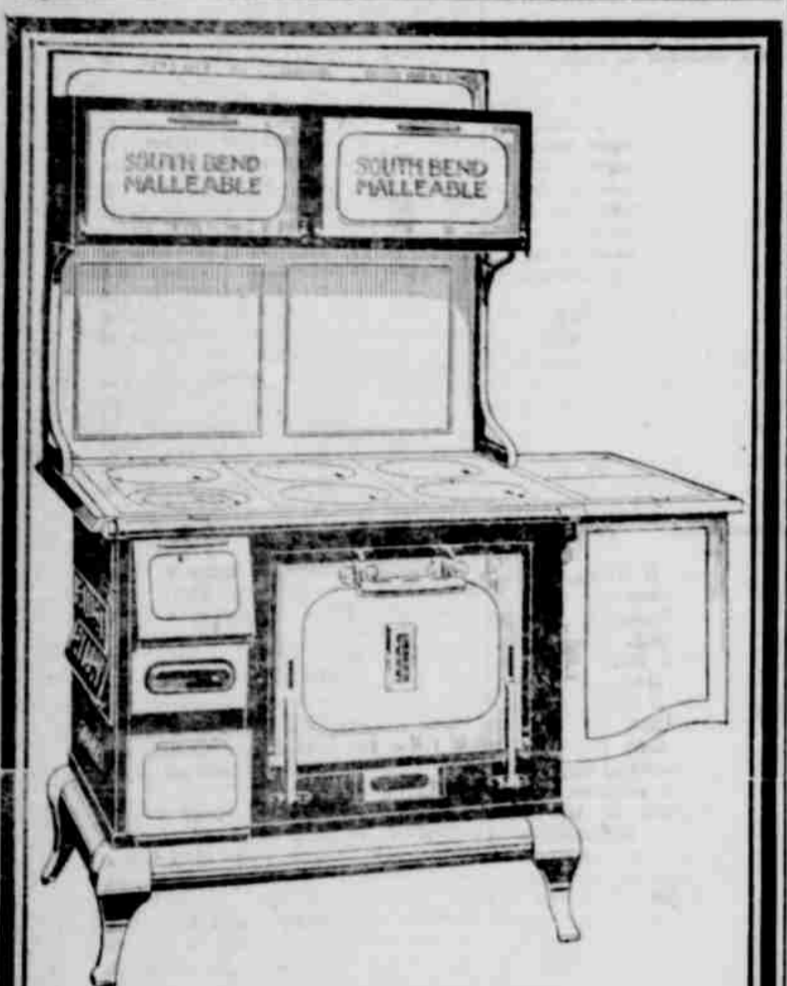

PORTLAND AUTO SHOW

Portland's municipal auditorium will be just bulging with surprises for the motoring public of the northwest when the Twelfth Annual Automobile show opens January 10th, continuing to the 13th inclusive. A million dollar display of automotive products with a background of Portland's famous flower—the rose—will greet the residents of this section of the country who attend the annual event.

"The Beauty Show of the Automotive World" is to be the official title by which the show is to be known this year, and is especially fitting to the display of the automotive world for passenger conveyance this year, inasmuch as manufacturers are devoting much of their attention to models with lines of beauty and grace.

Especially prominent will be given to enclosed models, on account of the growing country-wide demand by motorists for this class of vehicle becoming so pronounced. The development of the closed car is reaching a high state of perfection in almost every make of automobile. The lowest priced cars manufactured today bear out this feature and are appointing their closed jobs to rival those of the higher priced makes.

Out of thirty-eight passenger car dealers in Portland, who are members of the Automobile Dealers' Association, thirty-four have already secured space in the coming show for the display of their cars. These thirty-four dealers represent fifty-one different makes of cars, which will be represented by 131 models. The 50,000 square feet of floor space in the auditorium will allow for display of 144 cars as originally planned, and the several dealers who have delayed making their application for space on account of re-adjustments in their organizations are expected to use up the balance of the space.
