LEGION NOTE

State legislation which will offer the alternative of a \$2,000 farm or home loan or cash compensation at the rate of \$15 a month of service for veterans of the World War, will be pressed by the Oregon Department of the American Legion. The Legionnaires also voted to sponsor in the legislature a bill similar to the Japanese law of California, aimed to prevent land holdings by Orientals in the state, when it was pointed out that the adoption of the California law caused an influx of Japanese into Oregon.
