Work will begin just as soon as the contractors can assemble their plants to the points in question and by midsummer it is expected that the paving will be completed as far as Gaston.

### MRS. ANTON PAUTMEIER

Mrs. Anton Pautmeier, of Fir Street, died Saturday, March 5, 1921, after a short illness. Her maiden name was Mary A. Brandt, and she was born in the Rhine Province, Germany, near Coblenz, Sept. 8, 1837. She came to America in 1882, and was married to Mr. Pautmeier May 14, 1904, in Portland.

Shortly after their marriage they lived between here and Farmington and a few years ago moved to the city for residence. She is survived by her husband. The funeral took place Tuesday from the Catholic Church, Father Costelloe officiating. Interment was in the Catholic cemetery southeast of Newton, Undertaker Limber in charge.

Mrs. Pautmeier left no children. She was a devoted wife and a splendid neighbor and a host of friends deplore her loss and sympathize with the bereaved husband.

Of her immediate family she leaves two sisters near Coblenz, Germany.

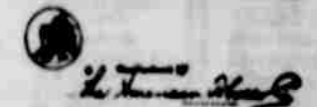
