MRS. R. C. TROVER
Mrs. Mildred Leah Trover, wife of R. C. Trover, died at the Washington County Hospital, March 16, 1921. She was the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. O. F. Swartz, of East Hillsboro, and was born in Kansas April 7, 1896. She was married to Benjamin Hiney, of Crook County, Oregon, May 23, 1917. The husband responded to the call of the colors in the world war. He went overseas and fell on the battlefield in France in defense of American ideals. Mrs. Hiney came to Hillsboro to reside with her parents. She was married to Mr. Trover July 8, 1920. They resided near the parental home. She was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Sheridan. Funeral services were conducted in the M. E. Church, Rev. Walton Skipworth conducting the rites. Interment was in the local cemetery. She is survived by the husband, her parents, and a sister.

BEE MEETING
A field meeting for bee keepers of the county will be held some time in April, according to the plans of John Behrman and Herb Schulmerich, who called at the Farm Bureau Office to ask assistance in securing the services of H. A. Seules, Bee Specialist of the Oregon Agricultural Col-

lege.
Mr. Behrman attended the State Bee Keepers' meeting at Portland recently and states that several of the counties are organizing Bee Keepers Associations for the purpose of promoting better bee keeping. More attention will have to be given bees on account of the prevalence of foul brood. One bee keeper has said "that the foul brood makes a nuisance which keeps bees out of a man who keeps bees or he quits the business." Foul brood can be controlled, and the field meetings planned are particularly to deal with this question. Watch for the dates of the meeting--Co. Agent.

Henry Matthes, who quit ranching a year or so ago and is now enjoying city life, was out from Portland the last of the week--and remembered to look out for the home paper another year. He says that things are slowly opening out in Portland and he looks for a good year as soon as things shape themselves a trifle.

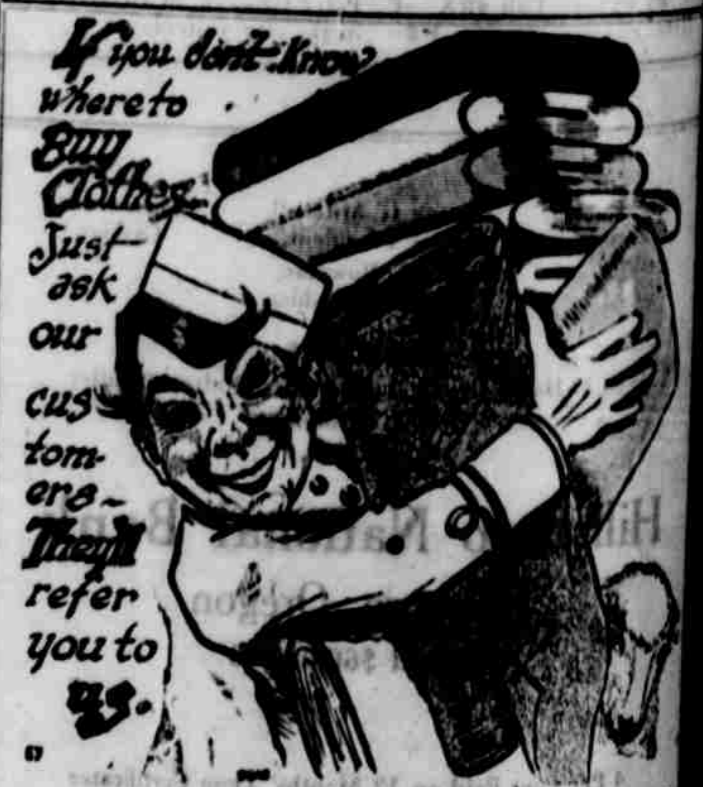
