He had been putting oil in the tank and had just stopped the motor and again started pouring when the gas ignited presumably from a drop falling on the heated exhaust pipe. The right forearm was quite badly burned, it being bare. The left arm, which was covered by the shirt sleeve, was not injured, but the left hand was severely burned. Freudenthal's face and neck were blistered and his hair was singed. He thinks that his left hand was singed because he used it to extinguish the fire from his hair. Ed says he tried to move the gas tank standing nearby, but failing in that, got away for fear of an explosion, and let it burn. The tractor was ruined. Dr. Smith dressed the burns and Ed is on the retired list for a few days—with 70 acres yet to put into crop.
