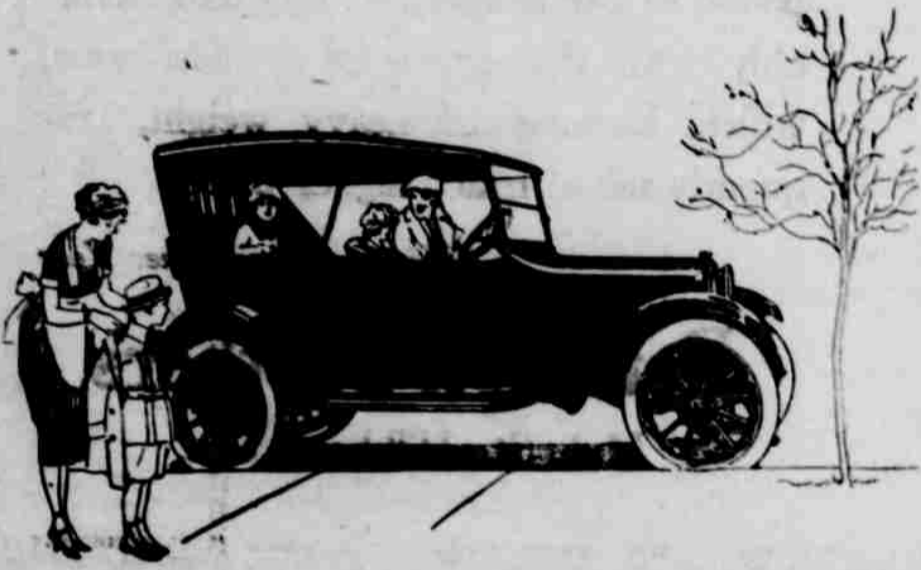

JERSEYS MAKE RECORDS

The first six Registered Jerseys placed on official test by Thos. Williams of the Hillside Community have made average yearly records of 619.02 pounds of butter fat. This does not represent a selection of six good cows from a number that have been officially tested, but it is the record of the first six tested in this herd. Four of the cows were three years old at the beginning of the test, and one was a six year old. The highest individual record made from this group of six cows was by Olalla 2nd, age three years and 11 months at beginning of test, who has 733.36 pounds of butter fat, and 13388.7 pounds in 365 days.

Another set of fine records made by Washington County Jerseys is by six in the Geo. F. Biersdorf herd at Schefflin, which have an average record of 623 pounds of fat for the year ending about January, 1921. There were only two mature cows in this group of six.

Washington County has some of the best Jerseys to be found in Oregon, and sometimes we fail to appreciate what we have right at home.

BEE KEEPERS MEETING

On the request of John Behrman and Herb Schulerich an all-day bee keepers meeting has been arranged for on April 23rd, at the farm of Herb Schulerich, south of Hillsboro. This will be a picnic affair and bee keepers are asked to bring their lunch and families with them.

H. A. Scullen, Bee Specialist from the Oregon Agricultural College, will be the chief lecturer and demonstrator throughout the day. The first demonstration and lecture will be held at 10:00 A. M. Bee diseases are reported as being quite prevalent in the county, and this day of demonstrations has been arranged that bee keepers might get together and talk over their troubles.

BULLS EXCHANGED

Thos. Williams and J. H. Beeman, of the Hillside Community, have arranged an exchange of dairy bulls. This places at the head of Mr. Beeman's herd, one of Mr. Williams' Registered Jersey bulls from a dam with an official record of 338 pounds of butter fat at two years of age, and milking two times per day.
