Industrial News of State is Encouraging

Wasco, Hood River, Lincoln and Curry counties will vote on \$1,640,000 road bond issues at the June 7 election.

Salem carpenters lower scale of wages from \$7.50 to \$7.20. Many carpenters working at \$5 a day. State jobs compelled to pay scale. Until very recently state work at Eugene and Corvallis paid \$8.

Portland has \$2,234,000 sewers and \$834,000 street work contracted.

Albany to have two-story brick building, 25 by 100.

New Era—Clackamas county Pomona grange advocates \$5 poll tax.

Tigard reports a building boom in town and suburban homes.

Portland—1000 new homes are being planned and under construction.

Astoria has 8 conventions booked for 1921.

Marion county sold 6,000,000 strawberry and loganberry plants this season.

Mt. Angel to have a new weekly paper May 1.

O. A. C. to have a student union building as a war memorial.

Eugene is to have a \$100,000 wholesale drug house under new federal dry law rulings.

Location of the north end of The Dalles-California highway, between The Dalles and Madras, has been made by the state highway commission. It will cost \$1,500,000, of which about 100 miles will be new construction and hard construction at that.

Salem to put down \$56,000 paving in 1921.

Malin has organized and will build \$16,745 union high school. Oregon to get same air forest patrol as given last year.

Salem—Local company makes large shipment of prunes to Germany.

Pendleton—A local cleaning company to have new \$12,000 plant.

Pendleton—Million of gallons of water daily to be added to city gravity water system when work of building pipe line from Chaplin Springs 500 feet to an additional spring is being developed is completed.

Portland—Milk takes another drop and is reduced to 10 cents per quart.

Gold Hill to have new bakery, work to begin about May 1.

Silverton—Construction work on new post office to begin at once. Other new improvements for Silverton being planned.

Reedsport—Local factory gets big order for 3000 panel doors.

Dallas—Logging camps of Willamette Valley Lumber Company at Black Rock resumes operations.

Baker—Lumbering in this vicinity reopens. Many large mills now in operation.

Grants Pass—Wage scale of county labor reduced.

Salem—The forest service will plant 450,000 trees in Oregon and Washington forest lands this spring, according to J. F. Kummel, in charge of reforestation for this district. The trees will cover 740 acres in the Rainier, Sentiam and Crater national forests.

Corvallis—City to vote on \$12,000 bonds for purchasing street cleaning apparatus and fire department equipment.

Contract let for Aurora-Canby route and work already under way.

FARMERS' WEEK

Oregon Agricultural College, April 26—Not fewer than 3000 farmers, housewives, and other citizens are expected to be on hand to take advantage of the many attractions the state agricultural college is offering for Farmers' Week, June 13 to 18. Rural life and home makers' conferences, co-operative meets, and gatherings of state and district organizations, will be interspersed with instructions and demonstrations in some of the fundamentals of agricultural science and practice in Oregon. Excursions from all parts of the state, play and campus camping, playground supervision for the little folks, social and recreational facilities, are a few of the incidental offerings. Speakers of national reputation have been engaged—men and women who are standard authorities in their special lines.

As soon as Canadian thistle or other perennial weed patches appear they should be marked off so that plowing and other operations may take place without scattering the roots to other parts of the field. The only successful method of controlling these pests is that of thorough, clean culture, which prevents them from getting leaves above ground. The

very small patches may often be dug out advantageously, rather than take the risk of their spreading. In this case all roots should be destroyed.—O. A. C.
