Portland, Ore., May 4—The Oregon Tourist and Information Bureau, created by the last legislature for the purpose of fostering the development of tourist travel in Oregon, will begin its activities this week.

Governor Olcott has appointed the following committee to direct the work of the bureau: Leslie Butler, Hood River, chairman; Cameron Squires, Portland, vice-chairman, and treasurer; George T. Collins, Medford; George Lawrence Jr., Portland, and Wallace C. Birdsall, Bend.

The committee has selected as manager of the bureau, Sydney B. Vincent, who has made a study of the development of tourist travel, and who, during his regime as manager of the publicity bureau of the Portland Chamber of Commerce, furnished numerous articles descriptive of Oregon's scenery to various magazines throughout this country and abroad.

The committee has established an office in the Oregon Building, Portland, in connection with the State Exhibit. Tourists and others seeking information regarding Oregon will be supplied without charge complete information, maps and other data, to enable them better to know Oregon and its unmatched scenic resources.

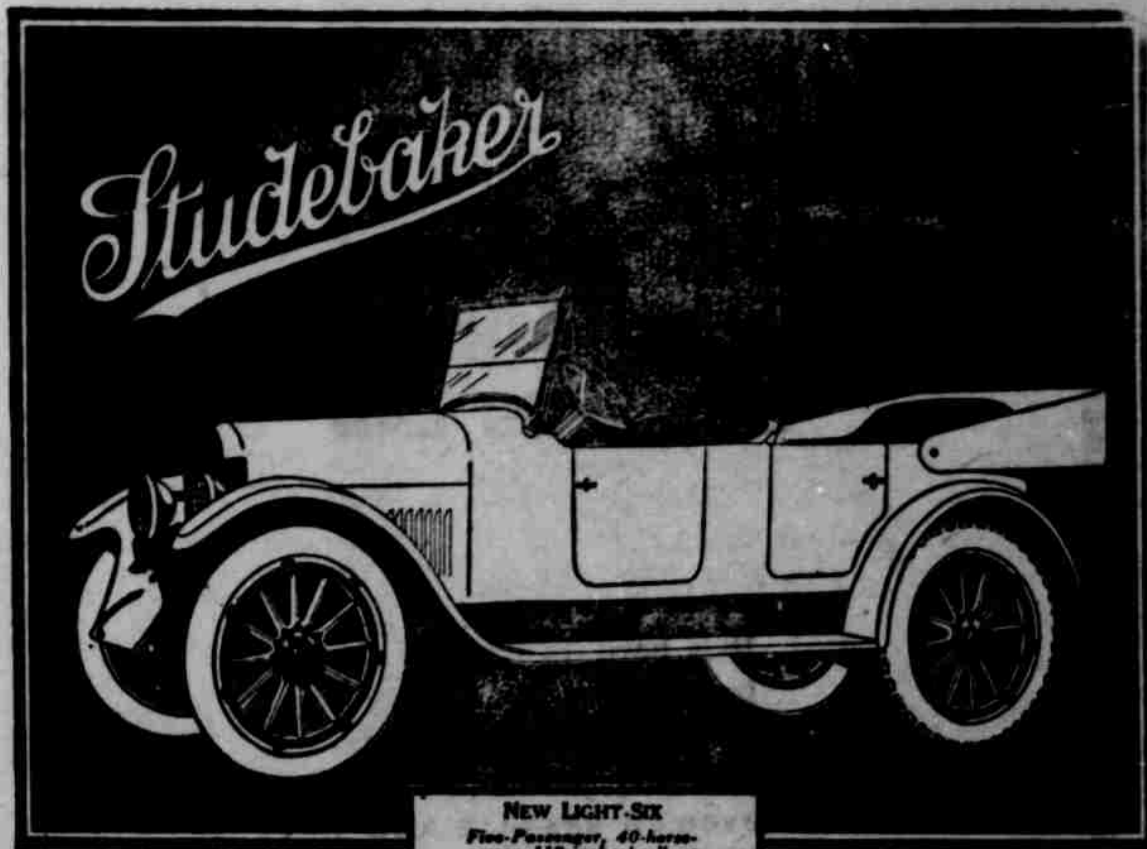
