A. J. RAY

Albert James Ray, well known hop grower, and founder of the firm of A. J. Ray & Sons, died at his home in Hillsdale, Ore., Friday, at the age of 53. Born in Nebraska, Ray worked for a time on the Fremont Herald until he came to Oregon in 1875.

Setting in Corvallis, he was a pioneer in the telephone business and operated the first local and long distance system in that town. He later became interested in the hop industry and started cultivation in that district. In 1895 he moved to Newport and started in the banking business, which he continued until he moved to Portland in 1899.

In this city he ran a loan and mortgage business until he established a dairy farm on Sauvie's island. He was one of the first dairymen to bottle milk for shipment to Portland. Returning to Portland, he founded the firm of A. J. Ray & Sons, wool and hops merchants. From this he retired in 1915, and later became interested in the Western Bond & Mortgage Co.

His wife, Mrs. Harriet A. Ray, and two sons, Harold W. Ray and Dean C. Ray, survive him.—Portland Journal.

Mr. Ray for several years was owner of the big Ray hopyard at Witch Hazel, but anticipating the decline in hop prices, went out of the business. His son, H. W. Ray, is connected with the Ray-Maling Company, owners and operators of the Hillsboro canning plant.

ROSE FESTIVAL

Portland, Ore.—The Board of Directors of the Portland Rose Festival Association have fixed June 8th to 10th as the date for this year's three day fete. For fifteen years the Rose Festival has been the most important celebration in the Pacific Northwest, and ranks in beauty and entertainment features with the famous Mardi Gras of New Orleans, and the New Year's Day floral parade at Pasadena.

The Floral Parade, always a thing of marvelous beauty, will this year be made even more attractive by the addition of new features. The automobile section of the parade is expected to include at least three hundred handsomely decorated cars. The Industrial and Port Development Parade will be designed to depict Portland's growth as an industrial and shipping center.

The annual Rose Show will be put on three days in the municipal auditorium; competitors from all parts of the rose growing sections of the United States will enter blooms for the contest. The American Rose Society's principal test garden is located in Portland and is expected to produce some new and wonderful roses for the event. Several new roses will be named during the show.
