Necrology Shows That Four Have Passed During Last Year

The Washington County Veteran Association met in the Veteran Hall, Court House, last Thursday with a banner attendance for their annual meeting. Officers present were J. L. Crow, president; E. F. Sias, secretary, and Robert Anderson, chaplain. The meeting was called to order by President Crow, and the Chaplain offered prayer. In response to the inquiry "Has any Comrade Died since our Last Meeting?" the Secretary read the names of the following who had responded to the last roll-call: Henry Harrington and William Wansborough, Hillsboro; James Carnahan and Julian Hatch, Forest Grove.

This exercise was closed by a duet by Mesdames Hyre and Startzell. The Association proceeded to elect the following officers for the ensuing year: A. B. Thomas, President; First Vice President, O. H. Cobb, of Hillsboro; Second Vice President, F. M. Crabtree, of Forest Grove; Chaplain, Robert Anderson, of Hillsboro; Custodian of Flag, J. M. Hoy, Hillsboro. The President appointed W. J. R. Beach, of Forest Grove, as secretary.
