INDUSTRIAL TONE BETTER OVER STATE

Developments in this country for the past week have been remarkably favorable. Commercial paper rates, supreme indicators of improved business conditions have declined from 8 to 7 and 6 1/2 per cent in New York, Time and Call funds are cheaper and even the steel trade is able to report substantial gains. The lumber industry shows gain and construction work increases.

South Portland to have branch library costing \$18,000. Riverside, Linn county, to have a community house. Astoria—New Youngs Bay sawmill completed and starts operations.

State Highway commission orders overhead crossings on railroads in Union and Baker counties, costing \$275,000. Eugene—A \$150,000 modern apartment house to be built.

Salem Capital Journal—"Total taxation for 1920 in Oregon is \$41,117,367, as against \$32,596,695 in 1919, an increase of \$8,520,672. The increase is due largely to special levies voted by the people.

Astoria has completed a ship-pier, costing \$1,200,000. Oregon City—Hawley paper mills plan another addition to the plant. Echo has latest oil exploration project.

Flax industry growing. One farmer at Aumsville has 110 acres planted. S. P. Co. considering building the Oswego-Canby cut-off. Albany—Standard Oil Co. to build three tanks of 1,000,000 gallons capacity.

Portland to get another 5-story concrete automobile warehouse. Echo—20,000 sheep sheared at Waternburger plant. Astoria finishes a \$1,200,000 dock warehouse, second largest pier in America and largest freight warehouse on continent.

Two Oregon City newspaper mills cut wages 20 per cent; also same cut at Salem paper mill. Marshfield—Starting of two Coos Bay sawmills employing 300 men to relieve unemployment situation. East side mill to resume soon.

Portland—Ten of the eighteen Columbia River sawmills operating. Lumber conditions improving and majority of Oregon mills resume operations. Nyssa school building nearing completion. Much building in progress in residential district.

Nearly a million dollars to be spent for state highways and bridges this season. Memorial Exercises General Ransom Post G. A. R. will hold their regular Memorial Day exercises on May 30. The parade will start promptly at ten in the morning.

FARM BUREAU NOTES

A committee of 11 representing the dairy industry in the United States is to be appointed by the American Farm Bureau Federation, according to a resolution passed by the National Milk Marketing Conference held in Chicago.

The conference was attended by delegates from 21 states and 61 dairy marketing associations. Mr. Cloverdale, Secretary of the American Farm Bureau Federation was elected permanent chairman.

The conference pointed to several factors effecting the dairy business which should receive attention. (1) An hourly wage was demanded for the dairy farmer and his help, to conform with the hourly wage of equivalent labor in other industries.

(2) A tariff was urged to give the products of the farm protection equivalent to that accorded to the products of the factory. (3) This committee of men will study the dairy marketing organizations in unorganized territory, strengthen existing organizations, recommend plans for the correlation of the various dairy products, cooperative marketing activities in a National way.

In his opening remarks before the conference, Chairman Cloverdale declared that it is the desire of the American Farm Bureau Federation to give the greatest assistance possible to the existing dairy products marketing, associations and also to be of service to the unorganized territory. "The machinery of the American Farm Bureau Federation is at the service of the dairy interests," he said.

"We are not here to dictate the policies or to dominate this meeting. We hope that you will work out some plans by which we can assist in developing a milk marketing plan for an unorganized territory and in making stronger the organizations already in existence."

The sample of artillery harness will be at the Farm Bureau office for a few days longer. Four sets have thus far been purchased by farmers.

Wheat Marketing The representatives of the Oregon Cooperative Grain Growers' Association; an organization of farmers, report considerable interest taken in cooperative marketing of wheat and a number of contracts have been signed up.

The Executive Committee of the Clackamas County Farm Bureau is handling the campaign in that county, and a number of meetings have been scheduled this week for the purpose of explaining the cooperative marketing plan for handling wheat in Oregon.
