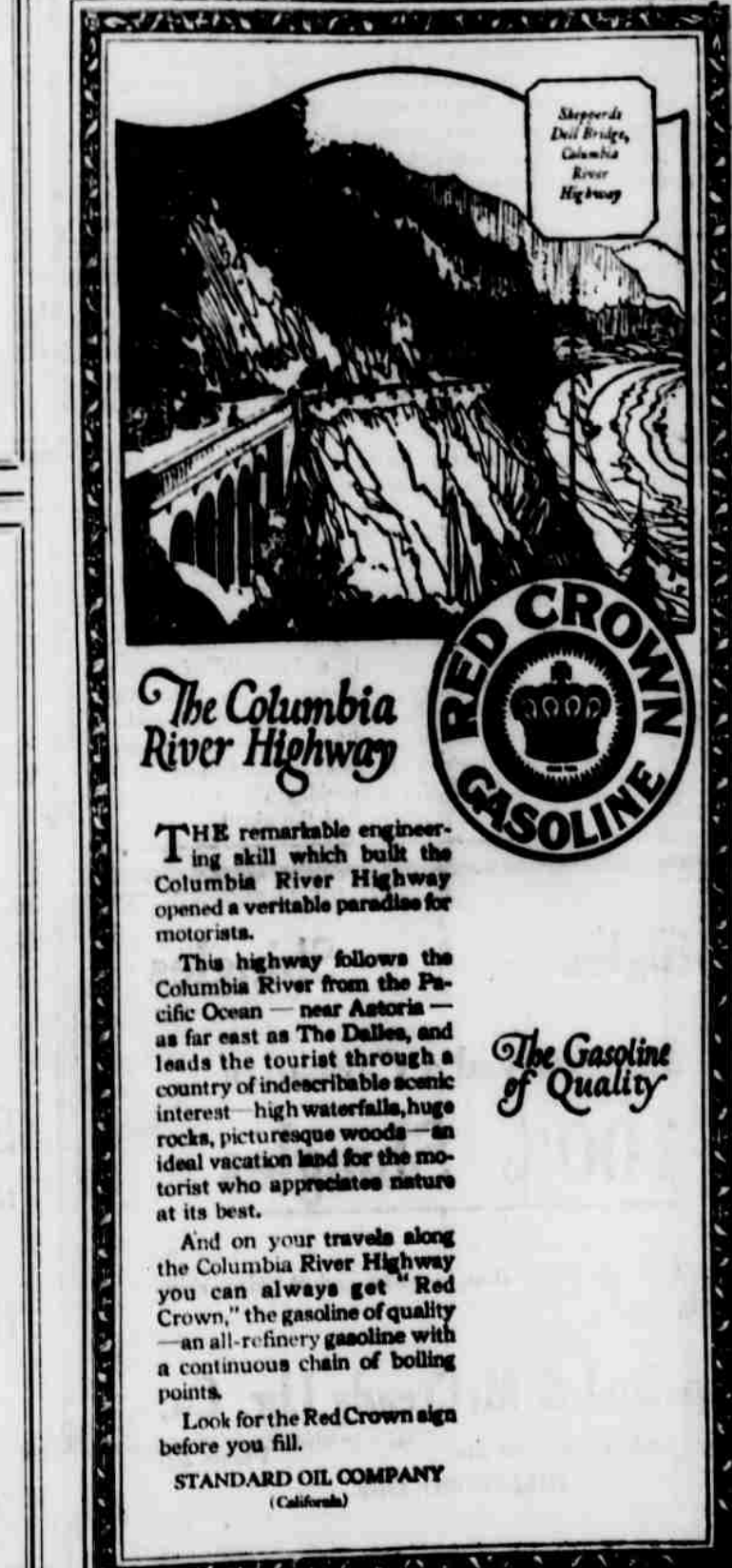

LIGHT SIGNALS
 The Southern Pacific Company will soon have their automatic light signals established between Portland and Beaverton, and the device will prevent a repetition of the Bertha collision of a year. A number of these signals were in operation the middle of last month, and the others will be in operation this week. The entire system will consist of twenty electric automatic light signals of the latest design, and protects ten miles of single track. The installation cost about \$44,000. Under the new system it will be impossible for train collisions if the motorman looks at the lights, day or night.
 The S. P. has also started construction of the tunnel at Elk Rock, near Oswego, and Houser & Co. have the contract. The tunnel will do away with 1046 feet of dangerous trestle skirting the Willamette river.
