SPRAY TIME

The next codling moth spray will be due in Western Oregon from July 20 to 25, is the advice of the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station. Prof. Lovett, entomologist at the station, says: "The activities of the codling moth have been particularly difficult to follow this season and the broods yet are not clearly defined. Based on careful observations, however, it is advised generally that the July spray be made July 20th, although where pressure of work interferes it would appear that the application may be delayed until the 25th with safety."

Deputy Stockdale asks the Argus to publish the following section of the statute relative to motor trucks carrying mirrors—"Every motor truck shall be so equipped with a mirror or other device to enable the driver thereof to have a clear and unobstructed view of the rear at all times and under all conditions of load as will enable him to see any other vehicles approaching from the rear on an unobstructed road." This law is now in effect and patrolmen will expect all motor truck owners and drivers to follow the statute.
