TWENTY MILLIONS TO EAST

Local Mill Shipping Out Sixteen Carloads

Evidence of the revival of the lumber business is made manifest in the fact that the Tillamook line is bringing in more carloads of logs than at any time in its history. There is a big demand in the Orient for Oregon lumber and 20 million feet go to Japan and China out of Portland this month. The G. H. P. Lumber Co., of Hillsboro, is this week sending in 16 carloads of timbers for Japan—the largest single order the mill has had for the Oriental trade since the year started.
