In the name of the State of Oregon, you are hereby required to appear and answer the cross complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit by the above named defendant, H. A. Dryer, on or before the 19th day of November, 1921, and if you fail to appear or answer said complaint, for want thereof the said defendant will take default against you and apply to the Court for the relief prayed for in his cross complaint, to-wit:

That he have and recover off and from the defendants, H. W. Mahon and Mabel Mahon, his wife, the sum of \$1500.00, with interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent. per annum from the 15th day of March, 1920, and for the further sum of \$150.00 attorneys' fees;
