CHRISTMAS WEEK BIG FOR MILLS

Lumbermen Looking for Banner
Business, 1922

NEW MONEY TO THE COAST

Southern Forests are Rapidly Be-
ing Depleted

The report of the lumber mills for
Christmas week shows a gratify-
ing condition for the Northwest.
The coming to the coast of the
Long-Bell syndicate, with mil-
lions of capital and the location
of the Keith, Kansas City capital-
ists are indications that the South-
ern forests are rapidly being de-
pleted—this condition forcing in-
dustry in Oregon, Washington
and California.

One hundred and twenty-three
mills reporting to West Coast
Lumbermen's Association for the
week ending December 31st, man-
ufactured 45,986,310 feet of lum-
ber; sold 58,277,376 feet; and
shipped 52,090,524 feet. The un-
shipped balance in the domestic
cargo trade totaled 90,224,127
feet; and in the export trade 98,
695,556 feet. In the rail trade the
unshipped balance amounted to
4,029 cars.

Clackamas county reduces taxes
by cutting budget, abolishing two
deputy clerks and lowering sala-
ries of many officers.

Toledo—City raised \$15,000 as
bonus to start big timber industry
that will employ 300 men as soon
as housing is provided.

Astoria—Big tax-payers' meet-
ings budget \$450,000.

Indications are all salmon can-
neries will operate next year full
capacity.

higher than last year.

Portland to expend \$21,000,000
on building in 1922, \$5,000,000
by city. Exports for 1921, \$67,
701,000. Gain \$6,272,000.

resources of \$300,447,523.
