TO SPEND 34 MILLION**

**Southern Pacific and O. W. R. & N. Will Make Improvements**

**COOS BAY EMPLOYS MANY  
Government to Spend \$340,000  
on Oregon Road Work**

Union Pacific will spend \$17,000,000 on construction work in the northwestern states.  
Southern Pacific to spend \$17,000,000 on Oregon improvements.  
Coos Bay district giving work to 3,585 loggers and lumbermen.  
Oregon to get 500 miles forest road costing \$281,000; 424 miles trail, costing \$64,000, and four bridges, costing \$2600. This is to come from the U. S. government.  
Port of Portland foreign exports for March, \$4,400,243. Lumber, 32,035,026 feet.  
Eugene woollen mills running on big order received from China.  
Portland-Oregon hotel will build ten-story annex.  
La Grande-Palmer Lumber Co. to build ten-mile logging line.  
Eugene March building permits 250 per cent over last year.  
Vernonia to build \$25,000 high school.  
Myrtle Point to vote on \$30,000 bond issue for water supply.  
Cascade and Siuslaw forests allotted \$90,000 for road work.  
Cottage Grove-Lorane road contract awarded, bid \$24,840.  
Rainier-Standard Oil Co. to erect distributing station.  
Bend—Application to irrigate 20,000 acres in Arnold district.  
Portland—\$75,000 apartment house to be erected.  
Ashland—New wholesale warehouse to be built.  
State paying \$2,042,008 a year as bond interest.  
John Day highway between Prairie City and Unity to be built.  
Eugene—Farmers' Creamery to build new plant.  
Baker—A four-story modern apartment house to be built.  
Newport—\$29,000 natatorium planned.  
Highway to be extended 5 miles from Holdman toward Pendleton.  
Pendleton to purchase site for and build \$65,000 septic tank.  
Eugene—County road contracts totaling \$70,000 awarded.  
Lone Pine—White Pine Box and Lbr. Co. start work on factory.  
Seaside undertakes \$220,000 street improvements.  
Baker—\$108,000 contract for grading of 13½ miles post road awarded.  
Clatskanie—One camp output of 5,000,000 ft. logs per month.  
Monmouth—Contract let for a new bank building.  
Salem—Contract awarded for construction postoffice annex.  
O. W. R. & N. to spend \$1,500,000 between Pendleton and Huntington.  
Reedsport—About 100 new homes to be built this summer.  
The public service commission denies the application of increase on telegraph rates for press reports in Oregon—just a little "sop," affecting, perhaps thirty newspapers.

**AMERICAN LEGION NOTES**

Jobless and without money, F. W. Smith, of Omaha, Neb., ex-soldier and head of a family of three, grasped at the chance for "work" offered by the American Legion employment service, and sold a pint of his blood for \$25. By his act Smith saved the life of Edward Belitz, Belgrade, Neb., farmer, who had been severely injured.

Ten dollars for each month's service, with 25 per cent additional for overseas service, is to be paid world war veterans of Maryland, under the provisions of a bill which passed the Maryland House of Delegates with only four dissenting votes. The act provides for a \$9,000,000 bond issue, to be passed on by the people.

American ex-service men in New Zealand and Denmark have joined together and formed posts of the American Legion. The ex-service men's organization now has 11,018 separate posts, located in practically every civilized country.

When state officials of the American Legion in West Virginia heard that several ex-service men's organizations were considering asking Jack Dempsey to appear before them, they issued a statement which refused sanction to any affair to which the world's boxing champion might be invited.

Describing the Social Science club of the University of Wisconsin as a "group of un-American radicals and extremists who are inciting unrest among the student body," the University American Legion post has adopted a resolution asking the student senate to abolish the organization.

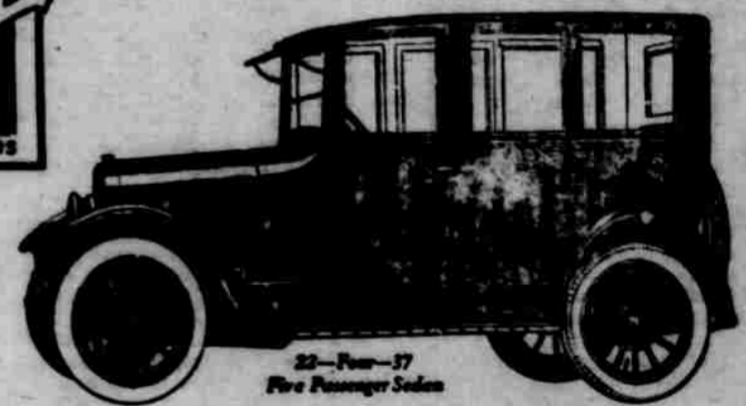

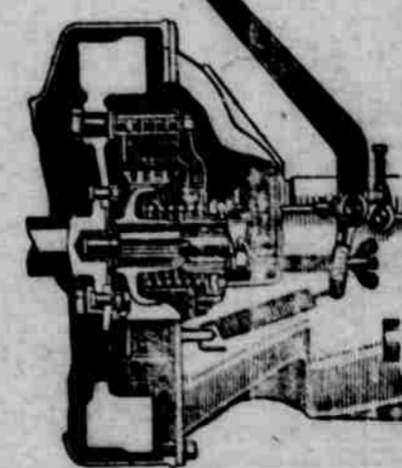
