CLOTHES FOR NEAR EAST

The local campaign being organized for the collection of clothing for the near-naked of the Near East is part of a state-wide and nation-wide movement. Volunteers have been enlisted and the campaign organized in practically every community in Oregon.
One pound of clothing for every person residing in the state is the suggested quota of spare clothes to be collected on Bundle Day, May 24th.
Churches, clubs, schools and many other organized groups are collecting clothing, emphasizing mills now operating, and this is having its effect on commercial business.
War-orphans and refugees in the Near East and Southeastern Russia.
"Warm clothes and shoes have to do double duty in the Near East," says J. J. Handsaker, State Director of the Near East Relief, who traveled extensively in that section last summer. "Not only must they keep out the wintry winds and snows out of doors, but inside the house they are called upon to replace furnaces and stoves, for the scarcity of fuel makes every day a hellish day in many of the Near East orphanages."
It is not too much to ask the people of Oregon to take a trip to their attics on Bundle Day and lay aside their cast-off garments to help clothe the near-naked of the Near East. Good is being done, on the other hand, by offering the American people the opportunity to clean out their closets of useless garments, the warmth of which will save lives in the Near East.
Take your bundle to the nearest Bundle Station, or send directly to Near East Relief, Portland. Bundles should reach Portland not earlier than May 24th or later than May 30th.
