KILL THE MAGGOT

Corrosive sublimate at the rate of one ounce dissolved in 12 gallons of water is recommended by the O. A. C. Experiment Station to use to pour around the roots of young cabbage, cauliflower, etc., to prevent root magget injury. This solution is applied two ounces each time three days after planting and at intervals of every ten days until four applications are made.

Corrosive sublimate should be dissolved by using a little hot water, and the solution then diried J. R. O'Neel, at Vancouver, an earthen or wooden vessel, as grounds of cruelty. She alleges it corrodes metal. It is deadly that the lord and master remained poison, so handle carefully.

CATTLE TUBERCULOSIS

The Reedville community, with the assistance of Henry Haag and the county agent and others, ed up 19 herds to test for tuberculosis. One hundred and fiftynine head of cattle were tested by the Bureau of Animal Industry and two re-actors found in one herd, one being a very positive case, and both showing tubercular lesions.
