SHOT-HOLE BORERS

OREGON JERSEY JUBILEE

Examination of occasional trees in the orchard often discloses numerous small shot-hole like tunnels extending through the bark and into the heart wood of the tree. This is typical shot-hole borer injury. Where trees are heavily attacked, it is best to remove them entirely and burn, but if possible to save the trees, take steps to revive them and then spray over the infested areas with a preparation as follows: Water, three gallons; soft or liquid fish oil soap, one gallon; and crude carbolic acid, one-half pint. Repeat the application every 10 days on all tunneled areas.

KILL THE MAGGOT

Corrosive sublimate at the rate of one ounce dissolved in 12 gallons of water is recommended by the O. A. C. Experiment Station to use to pour around the roots of young cabbage, cauliflower, etc., to prevent root maggot injury. This solution is applied two ounces each time three days after planting and at intervals of every ten days until four applications are made.

Corrosive sublimate should be dissolved by using a little hot water, and the solution then diluted to one ounce to 12 gallons of water. Keep this solution in an earthen or wooden vessel, as it corrodes metal. It is deadly poison, so handle carefully.

Spanish Green Olive Ring Sandwiches

The old question "What shall I serve" loses its terrors where you have a bottle of stuffed green olives and a few pecans stored safely away for emergencies. The unexpected guests drop in for the evening. The question "What shall I serve?" almost forces "Why, how do you do?" out of your mind. With green olives and pecans in the refrigerator and coffee in the canister, the emergency is met: Cream ¼ pound butter and add to it ¼ pound chopped nut meats, spread on thin slices of bread, cut in rings with a doughnut cutter. Cover each ring with stuffed green olives, cut in slices, placing them thickly so as to overlap. Scatter chopped pecan meats over the rings. These are open sandwiches.

tuberculosis in the same manner that Reedville has done, can do so when 90 per cent of the dairymen of a given locality make application. This application may be made through the county agent at Hillsboro. Application blanks may also be had at this office. There is no charge for testing when done by Bureau of Animal Industry.

During the month of April the county agent made 63 farm visits, held and attended 18 meetings, had 164 callers at the office, wrote 235 personal letters, sent out 10 circular letters totalling 523 copies.

Onion smut and onion maggot control demonstrations were planned and laid out with the assistance of the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station, R. W. Rasmussen, J. C. Leedy and Mike Conselman, of Sherwood, and Mt. Edwards, of Scholls.

The drainage specialist assisted several farmers in planning drainage systems.

Thirty-four farmers ordered small lots of acclimated seed corn in the Willamette Valley, which they will try out with the hope of getting an improved corn for Washington county which will mature early and at the same time give good yield for silage or grain.
