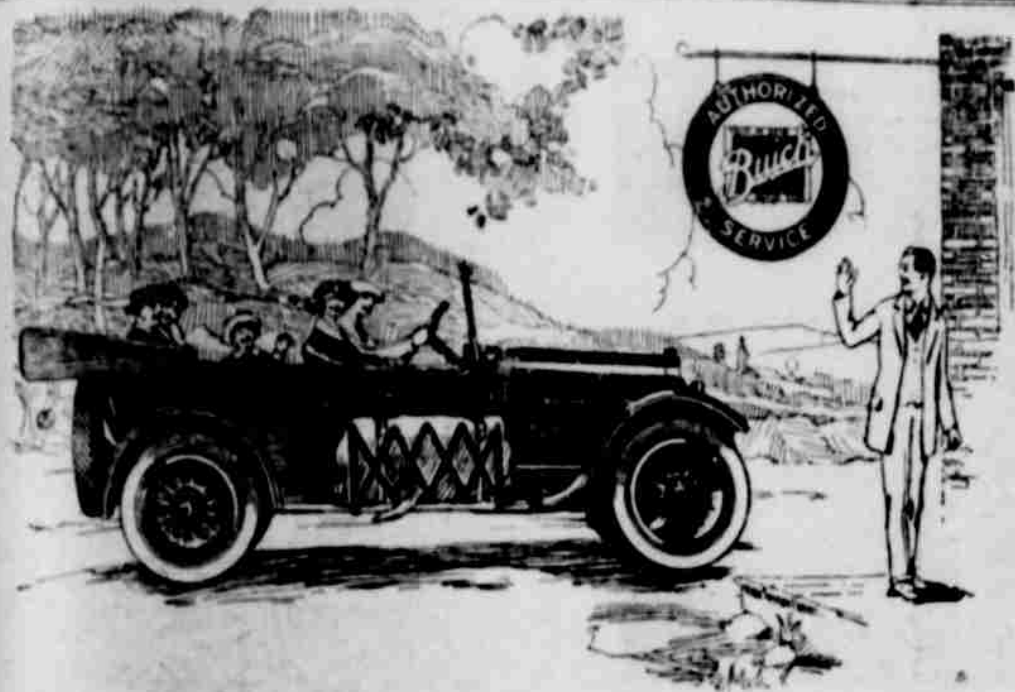

OREGON LUMBER CUT BIG BUSINESS FACTOR

Conditions Better Than for Three Years Past

AN IDLE MILL IS VERY RARE

Building Activity Reported on Increase in Oregon

Oregon's lumber industry is doing much these days to put money in circulation, and the mill that is idle is a rarity. Business is better with mill men than it has been for the past three years and building of business blocks and residences in the Oregon country is greatly on the increase.

What State is Doing—
Betsen—New \$25,000 shingle mill just completed.

Bend—Shevin-Hixon Co. cut over 11,000,000 ft. lumber in April.

Two Bend sawmills shipping 800 carloads per month.

Springfield—Booth-Kelley sawmill to start night shift by June 12.

Vernonia to get big sawmill. Bandon—Plant of Cedar Mfg. Co. installing machinery.

Highway ordered built from Neskowin to Seltz river to cost \$500,000.

Klamath county shipping in 10,000 head beef cattle for feeding.

Coquille—S. P. Co. to rebuild present depot.

Dallas—All bids received for city sidewalk construction rejected and property owners to be allowed to do their own building.

Dallas—Building several miles new walks.

Portland—May building permits \$3,206,110, double of May, 1921.

Hood River strawberry crop is estimated at 95,000 crates.

Salem—P. R. L. & P. Co. to build \$170,000 plant.

Portland—\$75,000 permit issued for new Christian church.

Eugene—A \$16,000 two-story apartment house to go up.

Portland—\$100,000 apartment house to be built on Hawthorne avenue.

Roseburg—Oregon-Calif. Power Co. to build line through Dixonville.

Toledo to get new \$35,000 hotel.

Silver Lake—\$14,000 received for 40,000 lb. wool clip.

Eugene—Bids being called for new \$70,000 hospital.

Eugene—Bible university to build \$12,000 dormitory.

Brownsville—Standard Oil Co. making \$20,000 improvements here.

Corvallis—More than half-dozen business structures under construction.

Silverton to have modern \$25,000 telephone office.

LaGrande—New buildings, approximately \$100,000, under construction.

Toledo—Dam to be built to furnish water for city and mill.

Staxton—Cannery building completed and machinery being installed.

West Side Pacific highway being paved from Dayton to St. Joe.

Pendleton—\$56,761 bid accepted for septic tank.

Eugene—Stage line to run from here to Marshfield.

Pacific Power & Light Co. making preparations for launching largest construction project ever undertaken in Hood River valley.

Banks—Washington County Bank to construct new building.

Sandy—A \$23,670 contract awarded for union high school building.

Portland—Commercial Iron Works to erect new factory.

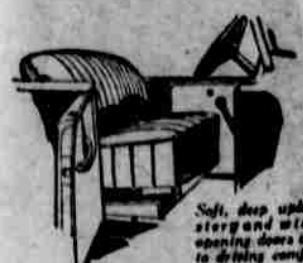
